SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. Information

• Student Chosen for National Ad Campaign

Fox Chapel Area High School student, senior **Hannah Petrucelli**, was chosen to be a part of a national advertising campaign for Aerie. Hannah is featured in the campaign which promotes Special Olympics, positive body images, and celebrating differences. The campaign uses #AerieREAL and also features Olympic gymnast Aly Raisman and #AerieREAL role model Iskra Lawrence.

The #AerieREAL campaign uses unretouched ads and encourages women to embrace their power and positivity. Aerie is a brand of clothing for girls and young women and is owned by retailer American Eagle Outfitters.

Hannah is a member of the Fox Chapel Area High School Best Buddies Club and is also a sprinter on the school's Unified Track & Field Team. The Unified Sports teams include students with and without intellectual disabilities. The Unified Sports program is part of Special Olympics Pennsylvania and the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA).

• Fox Chapel Area Grads Place in Mapping Competition

Three Fox Chapel Area High School 2019 graduates placed in the regional Draw the Lines PA spring mapping competition. **Rachel Himmel** won first place, and **Sofia Porter Bacon** and **Justin Breen** were named honorable mention winners in the Youth-West category. Rachel's map entry will now move on to be judged at the state level.

Draw the Lines PA provides resources, digital tools, and data so that anyone interested can use their free digital mapping tool, DistrictBuilder, to draw their own election maps. Entries were judged on the look of the map; its metrics for factors such as compactness, competitiveness, and county splits; the quality of the accompanying essay; and the amount of outreach that went into the entry. More than 340 entries were received from 29 counties, 21 high schools, and 10 different colleges for the regional contests which were open to adults, college students, and youth from across the state in their regions. Maps were evaluated by members of the project's three regional steering committees, including former Superior Court Judge Maureen Lally-Green, former state Senator Michael Brubaker, and former U.S. Attorney Frederick Thieman.

According to Draw the Lines Project Director Chris Satullo, "Our goal has been to help Pennsylvania voters show that they are ready, willing, and able to play a major role in drawing the state's election maps for real in 2021."

The state winners will be announced and honored at an awards ceremony in the State Capitol in Harrisburg September 24.

Draw the Lines PA is a civic education and engagement initiative sponsored by the Committee of Seventy, a nonprofit good government group based in Pennsylvania.

• Graduate Named Winner in City Theatre Young Playwrights Contest

Fox Chapel Area High School 2019 graduate **Jordan Jackson** was selected as a winner in the City Theatre's Annual EQT Young Playwrights Contest. Jordan's play, entitled "The Dream Series," was one of only six winners (three in the high school category and three in the middle school category) from nearly 400 submissions.

The six selected playwrights from Western Pennsylvania and Northern West Virginia, will receive a professional production of their original one-act plays during the EQT Young Playwrights Festival,

running October 22-November 2, in the Lester Hamburg Studio at City Theatre. Four honorable mention plays were also chosen and will receive a staged reading during the festival.

“We received almost 400 new plays and that made the task of selecting the finalists and honorable mentions equal parts challenging and exhilarating,” said Kristen Link, Director of Education and Accessibility. “We couldn’t be more impressed with the high-caliber writing these students are demonstrating, and are looking forward to introducing their unique voices to Pittsburgh audiences this fall.”

Celebrating 20 years this fall, the EQT Young Playwrights Contest and Festival is a cornerstone of City Theatre’s education initiatives, introducing students to the new play process and celebrating the creative and vibrant young voices of our region. Each finalist will work alongside a professional dramaturg over the coming months to revise and develop their scripts for production.
