The all-east chorus features the best singers from the Northeastern United States. The group was featured in a concert in Pittsburgh April 7 as part of the NAfME Eastern Division Conference/Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) All-State Conference.

—**Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) Region I Chorus** – Four Fox Chapel Area High School students were selected by audition to perform with the PMEA Region I Chorus. —**2019 PMEA All-State Orchestra** – Two students were selected by audition to perform with the 2019 PMEA All-State Orchestra. The students chosen were juniors **Noah Hertzman** and **Chaehyun “Cuna” Kim**. The PMEA All-State Orchestra included approximately 120 of the best student-musicians from across the state of Pennsylvania. The all-state Festival was held in conjunction with the PMEA Annual In-Service Conference April 3-7 in Pittsburgh, and culminated with a concert on April 6.

—**2019 PMEA Western Region State Orchestra** – Six students were selected by audition to perform with the 2019 PMEA Western Region State Orchestra. The students are senior **Theresa Heidenreich**; juniors Noah Hertzman, Chaehyun “Cuna” Kim, **Zeynep Ozkaya**, and **Jacob Rendall**; and sophomore **Alexandria Morton**. The Western Region State Orchestra included students from the western half of Pennsylvania. Approximately 120 students were selected for the orchestra and the festival was held at Hollidaysburg Area High School February 21-23. A concert was performed on February 23.

—**2019 PMEA District 1 Orchestra** – Eleven Fox Chapel Area High School students were selected by application to perform with the PMEA District 1 Orchestra. The orchestra was comprised of a select group of student-musicians from across the Pittsburgh area. The students chosen were seniors **Ruth Hartmann**, **Megan Hayes**, Theresa Heidenreich, and **Alexander Perez**; juniors Noah Hertzman, Chaehyun “Cuna” Kim, Zeynep Ozkaya, Jacob Rendall, and **Sophia Williams**; and sophomores Alexandria Morton and **Cecilia Rike**. A total of 150 students were selected to participate in the District 1 Orchestra Festival which was held at North Allegheny Senior High School January 10-12, with a public performance on January 12.

—**2018 PMEA District 1 Honors String Orchestra** – Eighteen Fox Chapel Area High School students were selected by audition to participate in the 2018 PMEA District 1 Honors String Orchestra. The students chosen were seniors Ruth Hartmann and **Zachary Lakkis**; juniors **Amelia Bothe**, Noah Hertzman, Chaehyun “Cuna” Kim, Zeynep Ozkaya, **Sydney Ulanowicz**, and Sophia Williams; sophomores Alexandria Morton and Cecilia Rike; and freshmen **Claire Hamilton**, **Jonah Hertzman**, **Nathaniel Mueller**, **Samuel Slember**, **Aidan Squire**, **Kaylee Uribe**, **Katherine Voigt**, and **Annie Yonas**. The orchestra was comprised of 100 students from across the greater Pittsburgh area. The students rehearsed November 17 and 18 and performed a concert November 18 at Fox Chapel Area High School.

• Fox Chapel Area High School junior **Noah Hertzman** was selected to perform as part of Music for All’s 2019 Honor Orchestra of America. He was chosen from numerous applicants to join other outstanding musicians from across the nation as part of this prestigious ensemble. Honor Orchestra of America members came from 23 states and represented 56 high schools.

Noah plays the cello and was selected as a member of the Honor Orchestra of America by recorded audition. The orchestra is recognized as one of the finest scholastic ensembles in the nation. The group rehearsed and performed in concert as part of the Music for All National Festival, presented by Yamaha, March 14-16 in Indianapolis, Indiana.

“To be selected from among their peers for membership in this national ensemble is a great achievement and honor,” says James P. Stephens Jr., director of advocacy and educational resources for Music for All. “The 2019 Honor Orchestra of America members are ambassadors of America’s music programs, as well as their states, schools, and communities.”

Noah is also a member of the Fox Chapel Area High School Orchestra and Ambassadors Orchestra, under the direction of teacher Mairi Cooper. A cellist since age eight, he is also a member of the Pittsburgh Youth Symphony Orchestra and a student of cellist Katya Janpoladyan. Noah has performed in side-by-side concerts with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra and the New York Pops Orchestra. He has been a member of the French Woods Festival of the Performing Arts Symphony Orchestra since 2014 and has performed solos in the festival’s Concerto Night for the past three years. He participates in chamber music quartets and quintets through Pittsburgh’s Youth Chamber Connection and is an alumnus of the Three Rivers Young Peoples Orchestras.

In its 28th year, the Music for All National Festival is an annual program of Music for All, one of the nation’s largest and most influential organizations in support of active music making, headquartered in Indianapolis.

Since 1975, Music for All has set the standard for scholastic music ensemble performance and music education advocacy. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit educational organization, Music for All’s mission is to create, provide, and expand positively life-changing experiences through music for all, working to ensure that every child in America has access to active music making in his or her scholastic environment.

- Fox Chapel Area High School junior **J. Oliver Choo** was selected as one of the winners of the 2019 Young Artists Auditions sponsored by the Pittsburgh Concert Society. J. Oliver was the pianist in a violin/piano duo coached by Marina Lupinacci of the Steinway Society of Western Pennsylvania. The duo performed for adjudicator Alan Fletcher, president and CEO of the Aspen Music Festival, and took part in the Young Winners Recital at Kresge Theater at Carnegie Mellon University on April 14. J. Oliver previously won the same Pittsburgh Concert Society honor in 2015 at the age of 12 as a soloist.

- Fox Chapel Area School District students won awards at the Covestro Pittsburgh Regional Science & Engineering Fair (Covestro PRSEF) and one student qualified for an international science fair.

Fox Chapel Area High School sophomore **Sanjay Seshan** was named one of four overall winners and qualified to participate in the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair (Intel ISEF) – the Olympics of student science competitions. The international competition was held May 12-17, 2019, in Phoenix, Arizona.

Fox Chapel Area High School junior **Rajeev Godse** was named the first-place winner in the senior behavioral and social science category. The Dorseyville Middle School award winner was eighth grader **Arvind Seshan** who won first place in the intermediate earth/space/environment category.

The Covestro PRSEF was open to students in grades 6-12 from 21 counties in Western Pennsylvania and Garrett County in Maryland. Approximately 1,000 students from more than 100 schools competed for \$1 million in cash prizes, scholarships, and trips. All of the students who participated in the fair conducted individual science research, constructed a display, and explained their work to a committee of judges. The science fair was held at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh March 29 and 30, 2019.

- Several Fox Chapel Area School District students won awards at the 85th Annual State Meeting of the Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS). Fox Chapel Area first-place state winners were juniors **Rajeev Godse, Zeynep Ozkaya, and Ameya Velankar**; sophomores **Catherine Heidenreich, Anthony Nguyen, Vinisha Sant, and Sanjay Seshan**; freshmen **Mona Gerges, Janise Kim, and Zoe Lakkis**; eighth grader **Arvind Seshan**; and seventh grader **Adhitya Thirumala**.

The participating Fox Chapel Area High School and Dorseyville Middle School students were among more than 3,000 students in grades seven-twelve who participated in the state PJAS competition. The students researched their science projects for several months and were required to give an oral presentation on their projects in front of a panel of judges.

The state competition was held at Penn State University (Main Campus) May 19-21, 2019. All of the Fox Chapel Area students participating at the state level were named first-place winners at the 85th Annual Region 7 Meeting of the PJAS in February.

- Several Fox Chapel Area students won first-place awards at the 85th Annual Region 7 Meeting of the Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS). A total of 15 of those students qualified for the state competition.

Fox Chapel Area first-place winners were: senior **Kathryn Schwartzman**; juniors **Rajeev Godse, Zeynep Ozkaya, and Ameya Velankar**; sophomores **Catherine Heidenreich, Anthony Nguyen, Vinisha Sant, Sanjay Seshan, and Dong Hyun “Simon” Shin**; freshmen **Mona Gerges, Janise Kim, and Zoe Lakkis**; eighth grader **Arvind Seshan**; and seventh graders **Lakshanya Rajaganapathi and Adhitya Thirumala**. The first-place winners qualified for the state PJAS competition that was held May 19-21, 2019, at Penn State University (Main Campus).

The participating students, from several schools from Allegheny and Westmoreland counties, researched their science projects for several months. During the competition, each of the students was required to give an oral presentation on his or her science project in front of a panel of judges. The regional competition was held at Duquesne University February 2.

- A team of Fox Chapel Area High School students placed in the 2019 Allegheny County Envirothon competition. The first-place team members qualified for the state competition and they are seniors **Diana Crookston, Kevin Falconett, Megan Hayes, Sophia Porter Bacon, and Nathaniel Roe**. The team won a plaque, a bluebird box, and a redbud tree.

For the Allegheny County Envirothon, teams of high school students compete in field testing using their knowledge in five topic areas – soils and land use, aquatic ecology, forestry, wildlife, and environmental issues. A total of 17 teams of students in grades nine-twelve from high schools across Allegheny County participated in the competition which was held April 26 at Boyce Park. The state competition was held May 21 and 22 at the University of Pittsburgh Johnstown.

•The Fox Chapel Area High School Boys' Varsity Tennis Team won the WPIAL Class AAA team championship. This is the team's fourth consecutive WPIAL Class AAA gold medal. Additionally, the team also won the WPIAL Class AAA Section 3 team championship and qualified for the PIAA tournament. Members of the team are seniors **Shan Hassan, Jay Kashyap, Jared Nord, Robby Shymansky, and Brandon Wei**; juniors **Avik Agrawal, Milo Baron, and Clay Quackenbush**; and sophomore **Zain Hassan**. The team was undefeated (16-0) in section play and finished with an overall record of 18 wins and one loss.

Additionally, Robby won the PIAA Class AAA, the WPIAL Class AAA, and the WPIAL Class AAA Section 3 singles championships. Seniors Jay and Brandon also qualified for the PIAA Class AAA doubles tournament.

•The Fox Chapel Area High School Varsity Girls' Lacrosse Team won a share of the WPIAL Class AAA Section 2 team title. The team members were seniors **Rudi Adamiak, Emily Ben, Makenna Blazer, Shannon Coleman, Marissa Hardiman, Rebecca Klaas, Makenzie Miller, Chase Murton, Julie Scheffler, and Sarah Sinnott**; juniors **Mary Ellis, Bryn Gerlach, Elizabeth Giuffre, Sloan Rost, and Emily Scheffler**; sophomores **Eliza Auffenberg, Alexa Correnti, Hannah Humes, Lauren Marotte, Emma Wecht, and Lily Zaltman**; and freshmen **Sarah Giuffre, Sydney Kennedy, Alden March, Hope Matthis, and Mira Tramontina**. The team's overall record was 12 wins and five losses.

•Six members of the Fox Chapel Area High School Track Team qualified for the 2019 PIAA Track & Field Championships. Seniors **Kate Carnevale and Sarena Seeger** (two events) and juniors **Christian Fitch, Abigail Kieffer, Brooke Krally, and Grace Sisson** (two events) all qualified for the state competition. The 2019 PIAA Track & Field Championships were held May 24 and 25 at Shippensburg University.

2019-2020 General Fund Operating Budget

A proposed final budget in the amount of \$103,873,087.00 as presented with 19.5750 mills of real estate tax and to continue all other taxes without change was preliminarily adopted May 6, 2019. The budget was advertised and made available to the public for review and comment for the past 33 days. The Board of School Directors and the Administration have reviewed any comments. A budget in the amount of \$103,803,074.00 is presented for final approval.

RESOLVED, that a budget is hereby adopted for the Fox Chapel Area School District in the amount of \$103,803,074.00 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and a copy of said budget as finally adopted shall be on record in the office of the Secretary of the Board of School Directors; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fox Chapel Area School District hereby levies and re-enacts a tax for general revenue purposes of 1% on salaries, wages, commissions, and other compensation earned by residents of the Fox Chapel Area School District during the period beginning on July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, and for each successive fiscal year thereafter and on the net profits earned during said period from business, professions, and other activities conducted by residents of the Fox Chapel Area School District, in the same form as Resolution No. 1969-5 heretofore adopted by the Interim Operating Committee of Fox Chapel Area School District on June 29, 1970; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fox Chapel Area School District hereby levies a realty transfer tax for general revenue purposes of 1% upon the transfer of real estate or on interest in real estate situate within the Fox Chapel Area School District for the period from July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020, and for each succeeding fiscal year thereafter by the adoption of Resolution No. 1986-2; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fox Chapel Area School District hereby levies and re-enacts a tax for general purposes in the amount of \$10 upon the privilege of engaging in an occupation within the Fox Chapel Area School District in the fiscal year 2019-2020 and in each fiscal year thereafter, in the same form as Resolution No. R-1972-4 heretofore adopted by the Board of School Directors on January 1, 1973; and be it

• **High School Teacher Wins Young Alumni Award**

• Fox Chapel Area High School multimedia teacher **Ryan Devlin** received the inaugural Young Alumni Award from Waynesburg University. The newly created Young Alumni Award is presented to a young alumnus, under the age of 35, for their accomplishments and service, by having distinguished themselves as a leader among their peers and in their profession, community, and/or the university.

Prior to coming to the Fox Chapel Area School District in August of 2016, Mr. Devlin previously taught at Hughes Primary School in Canberra, Australia, and Brockway Area High School in Brockway, Pennsylvania. In 2013, he was named Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year and was honored at the White House by President Obama as a finalist for National Teacher of the Year. Throughout his teaching career, Mr. Devlin has been a cross country coach, grant writer, department chair, and Teaching Channel contributor. In the summer of 2017, he traveled to Ethiopia on a Fulbright-Hays Scholarship where he wrote curriculum and produced an educational documentary on Ethiopian folklore.

Mr. Devlin earned a bachelor's degree in secondary English education at Waynesburg University in 2007, and a master's degree in educational leadership at California University of Pennsylvania.

The award was presented to Mr. Devlin at the annual President's Donor and Scholarship Recognition Dinner April 6, 2019, at Waynesburg University.

• **DMS Band Wins First Place**

The Dorseyville Middle School Honors Band earned first place at a Music in the Parks Festival. The band also earned a rating of “Superior,” which is the highest rating possible, and received the Best Overall Jr. High/Middle School Band award for obtaining the highest score in the competition. The Music in the Parks festival was held May 17, 2019, at Cedar Point in Sandusky, Ohio.

The Dorseyville Middle School Honors Band includes 52 sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students. The band is under the direction of teacher **Anne Osterle Goggin**.

• **DMS Choirs Win Awards**

The Dorseyville Middle School (DMS) Girls Chamber Chorus and the DMS FoxTones performed both independently and together as the DMS Mixed Choir at a Music in the Parks Festival in Maryland. The Mixed Choir took first place and was rated “Excellent,” the second highest rating. The DMS Girls Chamber Chorus also placed first, earned the highest rating of “Superior,” and received the best Overall Jr. High/Middle School Choir award. The DMS FoxTones earned a first place and a rating of “Superior.” Additionally, the DMS groups were the only choirs, in both the middle school and high school divisions, to receive “Superior” ratings. The Music in the Parks Festival was held May 10 and 11, 2019, at Blake High School in Silver Spring, Maryland, with the awards ceremony at Six Flags America Baltimore/Washington, DC in Bowie, Maryland. Middle school and high school students from Maryland, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, and Virginia participated in the festival.

The Dorseyville Middle School Girls Chamber Chorus includes 30 girls in sixth through eighth grades; the FoxTones includes 20 boys in grades six through eight; and the Mixed Choir (made up of the Girls Chamber Chorus and the FoxTones) includes 50 boys and girls in grades six through eight. The choirs are under the direction of teacher **Amy Beresik**.

• **DMS Orchestras Win First-Place Awards**

The Dorseyville Middle School Philharmonic and Sinfonia orchestras placed at a Music in the Parks Festival. The Philharmonic placed first in its division with a “Superior” rating and won first-place overall orchestra. The Sinfonia also placed first in its division with a “Superior” rating. The orchestras received trophies for their winning performances.

Additionally, DMS seventh grader **Mia Costello** won the Outstanding Instrumental Soloist Award. This honor is given to a student who performed an outstanding solo during the competition and Mia was selected from all of the bands and orchestras in attendance. This is the first time a Dorseyville Middle School student has ever won this prestigious designation. Mia, a violinist, is also the concertmaster for the DMS orchestras.

The Music in the Parks Festival was held April 26 & 27, 2019, at King’s Island, near Cincinnati, Ohio. A total of eight middle school and high school orchestras from several states competed at the event.

The Dorseyville Middle School Philharmonic Orchestra includes 48 students and the Sinfonia Orchestra has 17 students, all in grades six, seven, and eight. The orchestras are under the direction of teacher **Jeff Bryer**.

• **High School National Merit High Scorers**

Twenty-six Fox Chapel Area High School rising seniors are among the 50,000 highest-scoring participants on the 2018 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) and have met the requirements to enter the 2020 National Merit Scholarship Program. The students are **Paige Asbury, Amelia Bothe, Jackson Boychuk, Hanna Chen, J. Oliver Choo, Hazel Cline, Oskar Ernharth, Claire Fenton, Rachel Ferris, Rajeev Godse, Evan Gu, Noah Hertzman, Abigail Miller, Zeynep Ozkaya, Christiana Paljug, Leda Perdriel-Arons, Anzu Sekikawa, Sina Shaikh, David Shin, Jake Sperry, Shane Susnak, Ameya Velankar, Felix Veser, William Wang, Michael Weiss, and Aaron Wu**. Approximately 1.6 million students took the 2018 PSAT/NMSQT and these Fox Chapel Area students are among the 50,000 highest-scoring participants on that test from across the nation.

Approximately 16,000 of these highest scoring students will be named National Merit Program Semifinalists in September 2019, representing the top scorers in each state, and approximately 34,000 of the students will be commended for their performance on the PSAT/NMSQT. The Semifinalists will have the opportunity to continue in the competition for about 7,500 Merit Scholarship awards to be offered in 2020.

• **High School Students in Top Eight in Nation in Forensic Tournament**

Fox Chapel Area High School junior **Rajeev Godse** and sophomore **Jackson Romero** advanced to the quarterfinal round in Policy Debate at the National Catholic Forensic League Grand National

Championship Tournament. This accomplishment places them in the top eight Policy Debate teams in the nation. The Grand National Championship Tournament was held May 24-26, 2019, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Rajeev and Jackson qualified to represent the Pittsburgh Diocese at the national tournament by placing first in Policy Debate at the Pittsburgh Diocesan Qualifying Tournament for the National Catholic Forensic League Grand National Championship Tournament in March.

• Students Win Awards at Regional Science & Engineering Fair

Several Fox Chapel Area School District students won awards at the Covestro Pittsburgh Regional Science & Engineering Fair (Covestro PRSEF).

Fox Chapel Area High School junior **Ameya Velankar** was awarded third place in the senior behavioral and social science category, was named a scholarship recipient of the Duquesne University Summer Undergraduate Research Program, and received an honorary scientist perseverance award. Sophomore **Sanjay Seshan** received a third-place award in the senior engineering/robotics category; a Fed Ex Ground, Inc. sponsor award; and a junior scientist perseverance award. Sophomore **Amulya Garimella** won a fourth place in the senior biology category and also received an associate scientist perseverance award. Sophomores **Michael VanDemark** and **Victor Yang** both won fourth places in the senior engineering/robotics category and also received Community College of Allegheny and Duquesne University–Bayer School of Natural and Environmental Sciences sponsor awards. Junior **Hanna Chen** received a sponsor award from Community College of Allegheny County; junior **Rajeev Godse** won a sponsor award from the Pittsburgh Psychoanalytic Center; sophomore **Vinisha Sant** received a sponsor award from the Allegheny County Medical Society Foundation; and freshman **Zoe Lakkis** won a Carnegie Mellon University Chapter of Sigma XI sponsor award. Perseverance awards were also given to junior **Jasmine Eng** (honorary scientist) and freshman **Justine Eng** (junior scientist).

Dorseyville Middle School award winners were seventh grader **Adhitya Thirumala** who won third place in the intermediate computer science/math category and eighth grader **Arvind Seshan** who won an Eaton Corporation sponsor award. Additionally, all of the middle school students who were named category award winners were nominated for the national Broadcom MASTERS (Math, Applied Science, Technology, and Engineering for Rising Stars) program.

The Covestro PRSEF is open to students in grades six-twelve from 21 counties in Western Pennsylvania and Garrett County in Maryland. Approximately 1,000 students from more than 100 schools competed for \$1 million in cash prizes, scholarships, and trips. All of the students who participated in the fair conducted individual science research, constructed a display, and explained their work to a committee of judges. The science fair was held at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh March 29 and 30, 2019.

• Students Win Awards in State Science Competition

Several Fox Chapel Area School District students won second- and third-place awards, as well as special awards, at the 85th Annual State Meeting of the Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS). Second-place winners were senior **Kathryn Schwartzman** and seventh grader **Lakshanya Rajaganapathi** and the third-place winner was sophomore **Dong Hyun “Simon” Shin**.

The following Fox Chapel Area students received these special awards in addition to their place awards: Kathryn received a Perseverance Award; juniors **Rajeev Godse** and **Ameya Velankar**, freshmen **Mona Gerges** and **Zoe Lakkis**, and eighth grader **Arvind Seshan** each won Perfect Score awards; Mona won a Karl F. Oerlein Award; Zoe received a PJAS Directors Award in math; and Arvind won the PAESTA Earth Science Award for Middle School.

The participating Fox Chapel Area High School and Dorseyville Middle School students were among more than 3,000 students in grades seven-twelve who participated in the state PJAS competition. The students researched their science projects for several months and were required to give an oral presentation on their projects in front of a panel of judges.

The state competition was held at Penn State University (Main Campus) May 19-21, 2019. All of the Fox Chapel Area students participating at the state level were named first-place winners at the 85th Annual Region 7 Meeting of the PJAS in February.

• **High School Students Place at County Envirothon Competition**

Two teams of Fox Chapel Area High School students placed third and fourth in the 2019 Allegheny County Envirothon competition. The third-place team members were senior **Eric Gurklis** and juniors **Hanna Chen, Sydney Svoboda, and Olivia Tang**. The team won a plaque, a bluebird box, and a redbud tree. The fourth-place team members were senior **Flora Gladwin**; juniors **Jacob Rendall and Anzu Sekikawa**; sophomore **Kimia Rafiee**; and freshman **Aurora Sauereisen**. The fourth-place team was also recognized for having the highest score in the wildlife category and received embroidered patches.

For the Allegheny County Envirothon, teams of high school students compete in field testing using their knowledge in five topic areas – soils and land use, aquatic ecology, forestry, wildlife, and environmental issues. A total of 17 teams of students in grades nine-twelve from high schools across Allegheny County participated in the competition which was held April 26 at Boyce Park.

• **Students Nominated for Outstanding Young Citizen Program/Four Named to Top 100**

Twelve Fox Chapel Area High School students were nominated for the Trib Total Media’s 2019 Outstanding Young Citizen Awards Program and five were named among the Elite Top 100. Among the Elite Top 100 were seniors **Zachary Lakkis, Ryan Setzenfand, and Glenna Van Dyke** and juniors **Abigail Alexander and Claire Fenton**. The other nominated students were seniors **Justin Breen, Diana Crookston, Theresa Heidenreich, Tristan McClelland, and Olivia Pistella**; and juniors **Grace Han and Jessica Klein**.

A total of 489 students representing 104 schools from across the region were nominated for the award which is based on academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and community service. The nominees and Elite Top 100 were featured in a special pull-out section of the Pittsburgh Tribune-Review / Valley News Dispatch April 17. The Elite Top 100 were also honored at a banquet April 17.
